Committee Updates

With the transition to the new year, membership for each standing committee is still being finalized. In the meantime, the following work has begun:

- **Communications** The committee completed updates to the <u>USAC website</u>, made multiple posts on USAC's social media channels, and drafted the monthly brief. Penn State leaders have shared that the process to provide an annual salary increase (ASI) to eligible non-union faculty and staff for fiscal year 2023-24 will commence in late July. ASI will be reflected in eligible employees' September 2024 paychecks, and increases will be retroactive to July 1, 2024. Read the full article.

USAC advocacy leads to new HR policy

The idea for a <u>new Penn State Human Resources policy</u> that allows employees who return to work for the University to receive credit for their prior years of full-time service began with USAC advocacy. The new policy, HR109, was created based on feedback that USAC provided to the HR team and establishes parameters for a one-time benefit crediting prior years of service for former full-time benefits-eligible, non-unionized employees who return to Penn State within five years of their last day.
